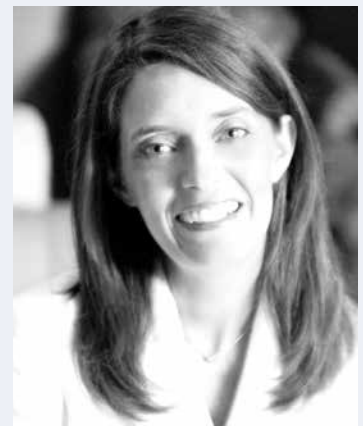

PASTORAL CARE

Stimulating the brain through the arts with Mneme Therapy®

LUNCH-N-LEARN ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 23, NOON TO 1:30 P.M. IN THE GOULD ROOM

Cathedral parishioners are invited to a Lunch-n-Learn about Mneme (pronounced "nemma") Therapy®. There is no charge for this information session, but bring your lunch or buy lunch from the Cathedral kitchen. If you have a family member with challenges such as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, stroke, trauma, autism, Asperger's, or learning disabilities, you'll be interested to hear more.

IS THIS ART THERAPY?

No, the two therapies are quite different from each other. An art therapist has a specialized education dealing with the psychology of the individual, and deals with expression of feelings and emotional healing. Mneme Therapy®, on the other hand, uses the arts in an instructional way to stimulate the brain's neuroplasticity. The goal is to find new ways to stimulate the brain to adapt and to rebuild lost functions.
