United Thank Offering (UTO) is a ministry of the Episcopal Church that offers men, women and children an opportunity to give. Since 1889 UTO has provided a way for Episcopalians to make a difference with the message of thanksgiving. The discipline starts in parishioners' homes by dropping coins into a special container known as the Blue Box. Boxes are available in the Atrium to take home. Many families and individuals drop a coin in the Blue Box each time prayers of thanksgiving are offered. On **Sunday, May 11** individuals and families are asked to bring their Blue Boxes to the Cathedral for an ingathering.



In preparation for UTO Sunday upcoming issues of the Cathedral Times will educate our community about the history and great works of our UTO. We hope to give you good reason to value this tradition as never before.

Every cent collected through UTO is distributed by grants throughout the Episcopal Church. In 2012 our own Holy Comforter Episcopal Church received \$26,400 to support the good works of its Friendship Center. Each year, the Diocese of Atlanta can make application for up to two grants.

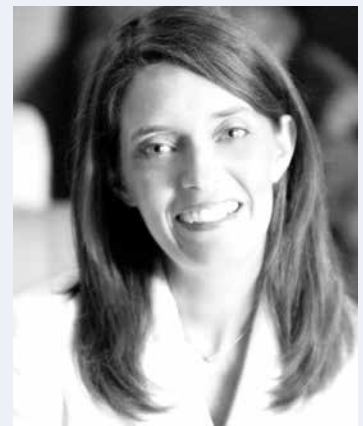

### Living This One Life Well

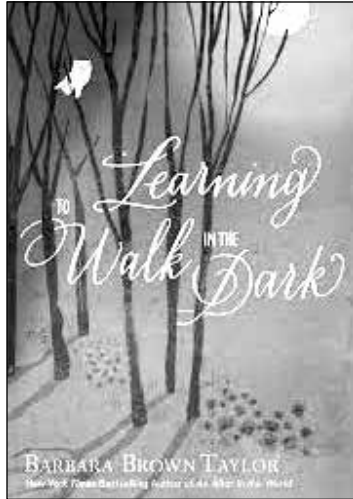
**Over-scheduled. Over-committed. Over-functioning.**
