The Cathedral Welcomes Two Noted Scholars to the Dean's Forum

On **Sunday, May 11** the Very Rev. Sam Candler welcomes Charles Marsh to the Dean's Forum. Charles Marsh is the founding director of Theological Horizons, Commonwealth Professor of Religious Studies at the University of Virginia and director of the Project on Lived Theology. He was born in Mobile, Alabama and educated at Gordon College, Harvard University and the University of Virginia. He has served as the Dietrich Bonhoeffer Visiting Professor at Humboldt University, Berlin, and was a 2010 Guggenheim Fellow in the Creative Arts. Among his numerous books is *God's Long Summer: Stories of Faith and Civil Rights*, which won the 1998 Grawemeyer Award in Religion. His biography of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, *Strange Glory*, was published in April 2014.



On **Sunday, May 18** Sam Candler welcomes Randall Balmer to the Dean's Forum. A prize-winning historian and Emmy Award nominee, Randall earned the Ph.D. from Princeton University in 1985 and taught as Professor of American Religious History at Columbia University for twenty-seven years before becoming the Mandel Family Professor in the Arts & Sciences at Dartmouth College in 2012. Randall has published more than a dozen books, including *God in the White House: How Faith Shaped the Presidency from John F. Kennedy to George W. Bush*. His second book, *Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory: A Journey into the Evangelical Subculture in America*, was made into an award-winning, three-part documentary for PBS. Randall's *Redeemer: The Life of Jimmy Carter*, released in May 2014, is the first biography of the thirty-ninth president to take his faith seriously as a way of understanding Carter's career and the religious context in which he lived.

CATHEDRAL ANTIQUES SHOW PRESENTS CHECK TO CROSSROADS

The Show must go on! Those were the words on **Wednesday, January 29**, following the first big Atlanta snow. And, the show did go on—with great success. On **Sunday, April 27**, Marion Williams and Katherine Hill, co-chairs of the Cathedral Antiques Show, presented Crossroads Community Ministries with a check for \$326,000—the proceeds of the 2014 Cathedral Antiques Show and Tour of Homes. Each year, Crossroads assists more than 3,900 men, women and children who are homeless in metro Atlanta. Approximately 21 percent are women and children, representing a 350 percent overall increase in the number of children turning to Crossroads for help since 2008. The money raised this year will allow Crossroads to provide more and better care and housing for this growing population of the homeless.

UNITED THANK OFFERING INGATHERING ON MOTHER'S DAY

United Thank Offering (UTO) Blue Boxes are available at the Cathedral. The blue boxes are an Episcopal tradition that parishioners take home as a reminder to recognize and name daily blessings, and then to make a small offering of thanks by dropping coins into the box.

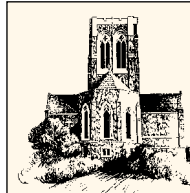
