The Cathedral Welcomes Randall Balmer to the Dean's Forum

On **Sunday, May 18**, the Very Reverend Sam Candler welcomes Dr. Randall Balmer to the Dean's Forum. Balmer is an American author and a historian of American religion. He taught at Barnard College and Columbia University for twenty-seven years before moving to Dartmouth College in 2012, where he was named the Mandel Family Professor in the Arts and Sciences. He is also an Episcopal priest. He earned the Ph.D. from Princeton University in 1985. He has been a visiting professor at Dartmouth College and at Rutgers, Princeton, Drew University, Emory University, Yale and Northwestern universities and at Union Theological Seminary, where he was also adjunct professor of church history. He has also taught in the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism.



Following his ordination in 2006 and concurrent with his academic responsibilities, Balmer served as part-time rector of two Episcopal parishes in Connecticut: St. John's Episcopal Church in Washington (2008-2009) and Christ Episcopal Church in Middle Haddam (2010-2012). In addition to his academic writing, Balmer has published commentaries in newspapers across the country.

Balmer has published more than a dozen books, including *God in the White House: How Faith Shaped the Presidency from John F. Kennedy to George W. Bush*. His second book, *Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory: A Journey into the Evangelical Subculture in America*, was made into an award-winning, three-part documentary for PBS. Balmer's just released *Redeemer: The Life of Jimmy Carter* is the first biography of the thirty-ninth president to take his faith seriously as a way of understanding Carter's career and the religious context in which he lived.

THE BOOK OF ISAIAH (ROOM 122)

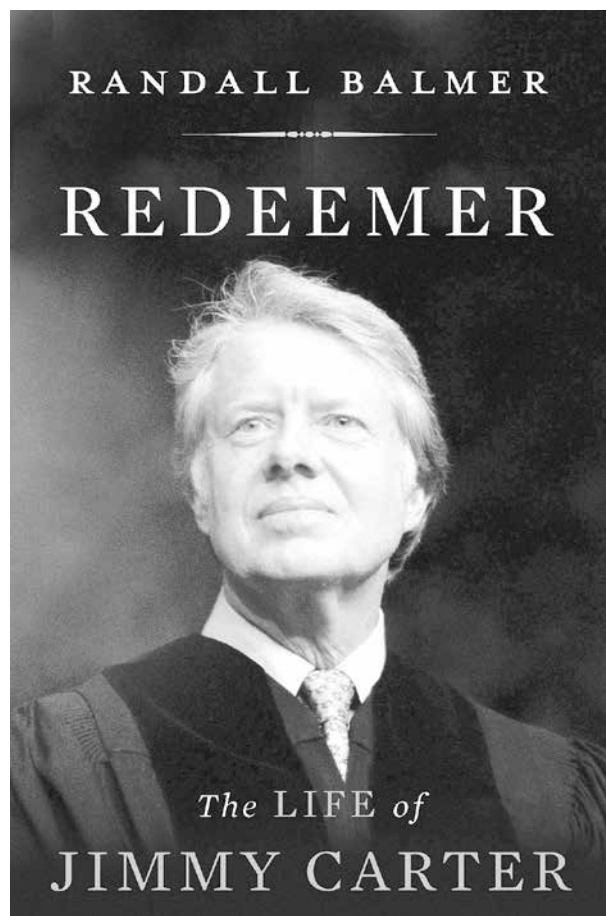

Redeemer: The Life of Jimmy Carter

PROFESSOR RANDALL BALMER, DARTMOUTH COLLEGE

Child Hall

In *Redeemer*, acclaimed religious historian Randall Balmer reveals how the rise and fall of Jimmy Carter's political fortunes mirrored the transformation of American religious politics. From his beginnings as a humble peanut farmer to the galvanizing politician who rode a reenergized religious movement into the White House, Carter's life and career mark him as the last great figure in America's long and venerable history of progressive evangelicalism. Although he stumbled early in his career—courting segregationists during his second campaign for Georgia governor—Carter's run for president marked a return to the progressive principles of his faith and helped reenergize the evangelical movement. Responding to his message of racial justice, women's rights, and concern for the plight of the poor, evangelicals across the country helped propel Carter to office. Yet four years later, those very same voters abandoned him for Ronald Reagan and the Republican Party. Carter's defeat signaled the eclipse of progressive evangelicalism and the rise of the Religious Right, which popularized a dramatically different understanding of the faith, one rooted in nationalism, individualism, and free-market capitalism.

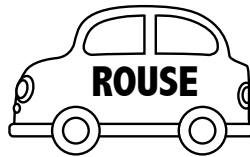
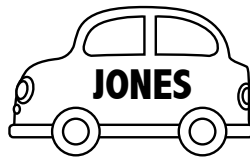
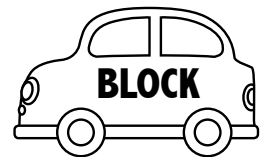

CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES AND EPISCOPAL CHURCH WOMEN

Craft a Summer of Caring for Your Family

Our Children's Ministries do a fabulous job of helping our parents develop in their children caring and compassion for those who are less fortunate than many of us. Our children in the parish demonstrate the results of these teachings in their generosity and kindness. Here is one summer activity that parents can do with their children during summer vacation from school and Sunday School to foster caring and help the three ministries St. Veronica's Guild is supporting.

PUT YOUR BAPTISMAL COVENANT TO WORK IN A HANDS-ON SUMMER ACTIVITY FOR PARENTS AND VACATIONING KIDS:

Help St. Veronica's Guild collect small (unopened) travel and sample size toiletries like those provided by hotels and airlines, and diapers, white cotton socks, and washcloths.

The toiletries will go to Church of the Common Ground, Holy Comforter Church, and Crossroads Community Ministries.

HERE'S HOW IN FOUR EASY STEPS:

- 1. Choose**—a week or two at start of summer vacation to start collecting, and choose who you will ask for help.
- 2. Contact**—family, friends, neighbors, anyone you know who travels or would like to help. Tell them about the ministries, how these personal care items help their clients, and the kinds of items we can use (St. Veronica's Guild will provide information about the ministries and a list of items needed, as below).

List of Needed Items (unopened and current date, please)

- Soap, deodorant—men's and women's
- Shampoo, conditioner
- Toothpaste, toothbrushes, mouthwash
- Combs, emery boards, washcloths
- Disposable razors, shaving cream
- Feminine hygiene products
- Baby diapers—all sizes, baby powder
- White cotton socks—men's and women's

- 3. Collect**—Arrange to pick up the items to be donated.

4. Contribute—Bring bags or boxes of your collected donations to the Information Desk in the Atrium at any time the Desk is open; donations will be placed in the St. Veronica's bin for pick up. Mark your bag with your name. At the end of the summer, look for an Honor Roll of families who have participated in this activity.

St. Veronica's Guild members will organize the collected items into packages that fit the needs of each of the three ministries. These personal care packages may seem like a small thing, but they enable these ministries to send a powerful message of caring to people who are homeless, or have mental or emotional disabilities, and mothers who need a safe place for themselves and their children.

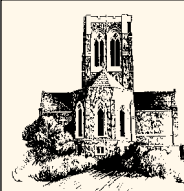
