On **May 17**, the Cathedral Habitat team celebrated the completion of their 26th Habitat home, partnering with Big Bethel, St. Luke's Presbyterian, Wieuca Road Baptist, and Dodd-Sterling Methodist churches. Unlike past projects, this home is located in an entire community of Habitat homes, on a piece of land donated by the Atlanta Gas Light company. The home was built for Nyima Diawara and her four children who will be buying the house from Habitat with an interest free mortgage which is the model for Habitat homeownership. Additional requirements for homeowners include a sustained savings account, steady employment, and contribution of 250 sweat equity volunteer hours to Habitat. Thanks to all our volunteers who helped build and who helped prepare food for our lunches. Special thanks go to the eager participants on our Women's Day during the project. This project also honored a previous Chairman of our Habitat team, Bill Nevins, who was instrumental in growing our efforts over several years. 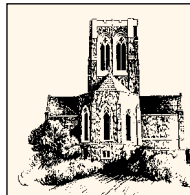
