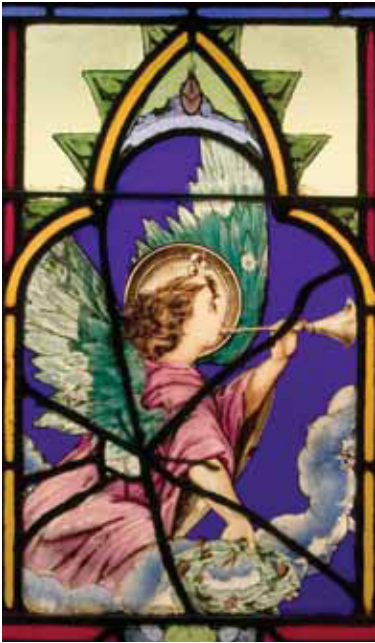

Bring your pets to be blessed by priests in the Cloister Garden.

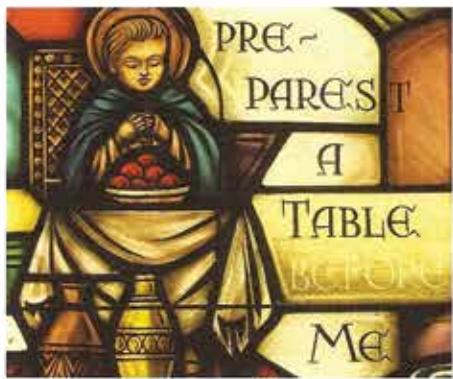
After the 11:15 a.m. Worship Service Animal Blessing:

GREEK CLASSES

The Reverend Dr. Lauren Artress is the author of *Walking a Sacred Path*, *Sacred Path Companion*, and the *Sand Labyrinth Kit*, and has been cited in over fifty books. She is currently an Honorary Canon at Grace Cathedral, San Francisco, California since 2004 in acknowledgment for her innovative, worldwide work with the labyrinth as a spiritually integrative tool.

In 1996 Lauren created Veriditas, a non-profit dedicated to introducing people to the healing, meditative powers of the labyrinth. She travels worldwide offering workshops and lectures on the labyrinth, on the spiritual hunger of our times, on psycho-spiritual topics such as forgiveness, self-acceptance, finding your life's purpose, and reconciliation. She is also inspired by and an expert on Hildegard of Bingen.



This day-long conference will include lecture as well as open question and answer discussion, and will cover: the labyrinth—its history, mystery, and meaning; meeting the challenges of our "hinge" times; the lessons of the labyrinth; and walking a wisdom path. 2015 CATHEDRAL ANTIQUES SHOW TO BENEFIT COVENANT HOUSE GEORGIA

Katherine Hill and Grace Foster, co-chairs of the 2015 Cathedral Antiques Show, announce that Covenant House Georgia is the beneficiary of the 44th annual event scheduled for February 5–7, 2015, with two Tours of Homes taking place on February 1 and 8, 2015.

Susan and Frank Troutman, long time contributors to the life of the Cathedral of St. Philip and the community, will serve as honorary chairs.

Covenant House of Georgia (CHG) is a residential crisis shelter that serves Atlanta's homeless and abandoned youth ages 18–21. Many of these vulnerable young people have been trafficked, abused, and exploited. CHG provides loving care and a safe place to live while acquiring the skills needed for a more hopeful future.

According to CHG director, Allison Ashe, “There are quite a few reasons why young people could end up living on the streets, but almost always they're fleeing some sort of abuse or neglect. We get a lot of kids that come here that I think a lot of people and institutions neglect because they see them as gang members or prostitutes or just kind of broken people, and they're not; they are little kids down deep inside.”

“So many of our young people have stories of them absolutely crying out for help throughout their lives, but the adults in their lives let them down ... We can't change the past for them, but we can give them the skills and really the belief in themselves, so that they can change their future.”

Covenant House has helped thousands of youth rebuild their lives by providing them a safe haven and comprehensive support services:

Street Outreach: volunteers engage homeless young people on the streets, urging them to make use of Covenant House's resources.

Crisis Care: Services are provided to secure a young person's immediate physical well-being including medical care, hot showers, clean clothes, nourishing meals, and a safe bed.

Mental Health Resources: CHG offers myriad programs to assess and meet the psychological and emotional needs of a population that is especially vulnerable to abuse and exploitation.

Educational and Vocational Services: Programs offer life skills coaching, job training, and educational resources needed to facilitate healthy, independent and productive lives.

“Rights of Passage”: A housing program provides the structure and space for young people to make a successful transition to living independently, using public transportation, and maintaining a safe and productive living environment.

The Cathedral Antiques Show will donate one hundred percent of its net proceeds to enable Covenant House to open a day center where youth who are at risk of becoming homeless, or who are living on the streets and are not yet ready to come into the shelter, can receive these critical services.

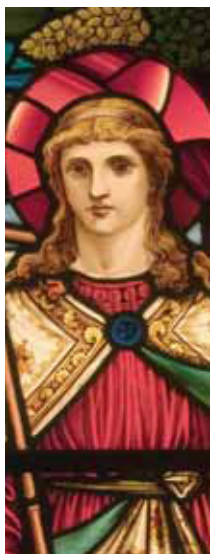
