The Cathedral Schola will sing a service of Christmas Lessons and Carols this **Sunday, December 21**, at 4 p.m. Modeled on the famous carol service broadcast each Christmas Eve from King's College, Cambridge, this is our most popular choral service of the year. Ancient prophecies foretelling the coming of a Messiah and the Gospel accounts of Jesus' birth are illumined by extra-biblical texts, anthems and Christmas carols that have inspired composers, choirs, and worshippers throughout the world and across time. Having observed the fourth Sunday of Advent on the morning of this service, we move from the season of Advent into the celebration of Christ's birth. For those who are traveling at the holidays and wish to celebrate Christmas with loved ones here at home, and for all who hold the message and music of Christmas dear, this service is a meaningful and joyous way to enter into the deeper meaning of the season.

A wonderful array of carols for congregation and for choir will be featured, including traditional works by King's College legends Boris Ord, Sir David Willcocks, and Sir Philip Ledger; beloved favorites by Herbert Howells, Peter Warlock, and Reginald Jacques; and more recent gems by living composers Morten Lauridsen, Eric Whitacre, David Schelat, Colin Mawby, and Matthew Owen.
