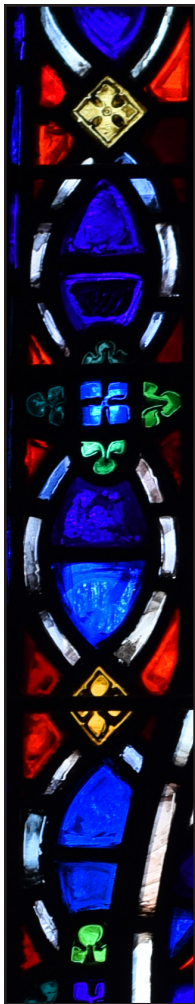

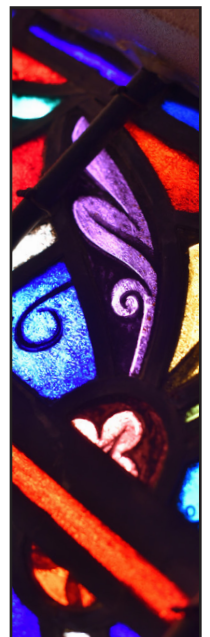

**Old Fashioned Sunday School: How to be an Episcopalian?**  
*An Exploration of the Foundations for a Christian Life in the Episcopal Tradition*

Building on themes of light and revelation, the Epiphany term draws on the Benedictine Promise—Obedience, Stability, and Conversion of Life—to help participants assess their own spiritual posture and that of their parish. We will deepen our capacity to notice the dynamics of the Promise in our lives, and explore connections between Benedictine wisdom, the Book of Common Prayer, and Anglican spirituality.

We are in the midst of a yearlong course designed to ground participants in the thinking and practices of the Christian faith as lived in the Episcopal Church. The aim is not merely education, but transformation: to set loose an energy in individuals that stirs new thinking and behavior—opening the way to a new place in one’s spiritual journey.

Through prayer, art, poetry, and storytelling, the JustFaith program, “This Land,” reflects upon the history and the impact of American culture upon the people of Indigenous Nations. The material looks toward an understanding of the past while encouraging participants to consider ways to contribute to relationship building for the future.

The class includes eight sessions, held on Thursday afternoons from 1–3 p.m., beginning February 12 and concluding April 16. *Please note: There will be no sessions on February 26 or April 2.*

**Monday, January 19**

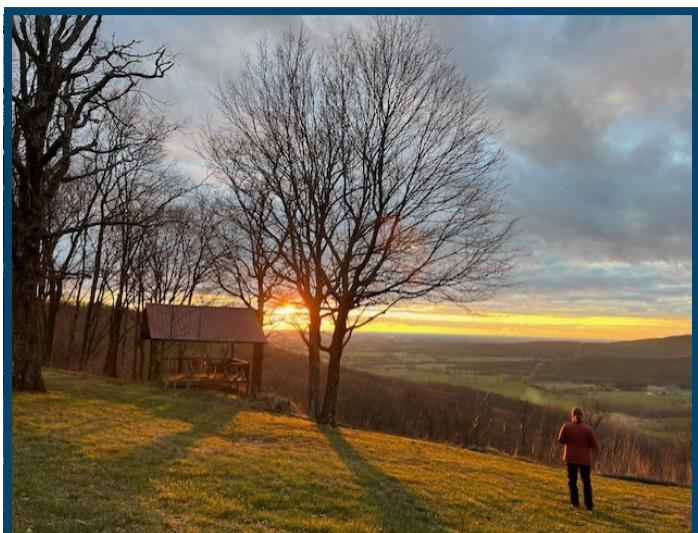
*7 p.m., Child Hall*

## BRAVER ANGELS WORKSHOP: SKILLS FOR DISAGREEING BETTER

**Saturday, February 7**

*10–11:30 a.m., Lanier House*

In this polarized time, we lack basic understanding of why people on the other political side hold their beliefs. We don't see them as they see themselves—their core values and central concerns—but instead as we choose to see them. We are tempted to regard our own side as principled and the other side as self-interested.

When we try to communicate across this gap, we often lack the skills for listening carefully, looking for common ground, and sharing our perspectives in ways that connect rather than create more misunderstanding.

We can learn to disagree better in polarized times, which means accurately seeing where we differ and where we share common ground.

### Goals

- More understanding of the values and concerns of people who differ from you politically
- Better skills for listening in a way so that the other person feels heard
- Better skills for sharing viewpoints in a way the other person might hear—even if they disagree

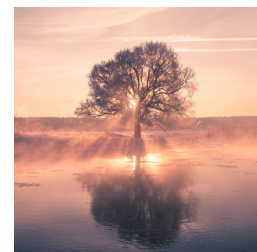
