HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU!

“I am glad you were born!”

That phrase has become one of my frequent comments to people having a birthday. I celebrate their birthday by being glad they were born! Their being born has changed my life. I have been loved by them, and I have loved them. That love, in both directions, changes the world. That love changes the world for the better. I am glad you were born!

I write this article on September 8, which is the observed day of another birthday, the nativity of the blessed Virgin Mary. This is an ancient observance, like many church feasts are; but the observance has no biblical reference. Instead, a late second century document, the *Protoevangelium of James* gives an account of Mary’s birth. Her parents were said to be Anne and Joachim.

Legend and lore take over after that. Mary might have been born in Sepphoris, Israel, near Nazareth. Other sources say Mary was born in a house near the Sheep Gate in Jerusalem. That place in Jerusalem, where Mary’s parents were said to have lived, is on a spot known as the shepherd’s pool. And it is on that spot where a beautiful church, The Church of St. Anne, now stands.

I have visited St. Anne’s Church, in Jerusalem. The acoustics of that church lend themselves beautifully to singing! I have led many a pilgrimage group in song, in that church. What glory!

We remember birthdays in order to be glad that someone was born. Whether or not we know the accurate details, we are glad—so glad—that Mary was born! She is the one who has carried and delivered the Savior of the World. She is the Theotokos, the God-bearer. We give thanks for the birth of Mary on September 8.

In fact, I give thanks for September 8, because it is the better-documented birthday of another person for whom I am thankful: my wife, Boog! Yes, I am glad she was born, too! I give thanks for the life and lives that she, too, has delivered to the world! Every one of us can be a God-bearer.

In fact, Boog—my wife—has been with me in St. Anne’s Church, in Jerusalem. We have joyfully sung in that very church. We have been glad for the life of Anne, the life of Mary, and the lives of each other in that church.

Whatever day it is today, whenever you are reading this, be glad today that someone was born! Sing with them! Be glad they were born, whether it is their birthday or not. Happy birthday to you! I am glad you were born!

SUNDAY AFTERNOON RECITALS AND EVENSONG RETURN SEPTEMBER 13

The service of Evensong (sung Evening Prayer) resumes at 4 p.m. this Sunday, September 13 in the Cathedral, and continues weekly. One of the jewels of the Anglican tradition, Choral Evensong is the English Reformation's fusion of the ancient evening prayer services of Vespers and Compline. It is, at its heart, a contemplative worship service, and much of the service is sung by the choir alone, employing sounds that span the known history of Christian music. Occasionally a classically sung Choral Eucharist, or a diocesan confirmation, or a service of Lessons and Carols takes the place of Evensong, and each week at 3:15 p.m., Evensong is preceded by a free recital in the nave.

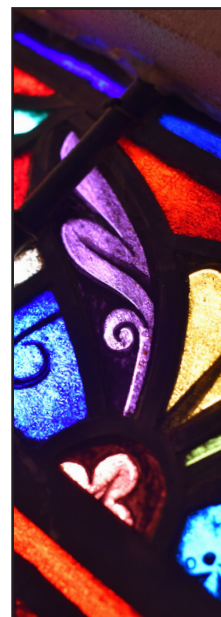

THE MINISTRY OF EUCHARISTIC VISITS

Help us stay connected with one another by becoming a Eucharistic Visitor or receiving Eucharistic Visits!

Eucharistic Visitors (known informally as EVs) are confirmed Cathedral members who take the consecrated sacrament from our Sunday morning Eucharists to individuals who cannot currently attend services in person. These trained lay ministers carry with them not only the Body of Christ but also Christ's Body, the Church. They take with them our prayers for one another and our bonds that transcend space and time.

This is an incredibly meaningful ministry for everyone involved.

Why might someone become a Eucharistic Visitor? Eucharistic Visitors find that this ministry helps them put their faith into practice, develop their gifts for pastoral ministry, and deepen their own faith.

Why might someone request a visit from an EV?

Certainly, some recipients of this ministry have been homebound for a long period. Others, though, might appreciate a visit from an EV because:

- They have a newborn or infant in their household and are sticking close to home for a while.
- They are staying in because they (or others in their household) are immunocompromised and need to avoid large gatherings.
- They have limited mobility for a while due to surgery, injury, or recent illness.

Cathedral CHAPTER

WE ARE ACCEPTING CANDIDATES FOR NOMINATION TO THE CATHEDRAL CHAPTER

The Chapter Nominating Committee has begun their work of assembling a slate of nominees for the 2027 Cathedral Chapter. They invite anyone in the parish to submit recommendations of qualified candidates.

As the governing body of the Cathedral, the Chapter determines policy issues and provides stewardship of the Cathedral's complex operations. Each month, the Chapter formally reviews the status of each of the Cathedral's parochial entities and ministries, and oversees parish financial statements. Unlike smaller parishes, the Cathedral Chapter does not usually get involved in the day-to-day activities of the Cathedral. In our large and complex system, the Chapter of the Cathedral operates as a board of trustees or board of stewards.

Each Chapter member serves a three-year term. Our Church By-laws allow for members to be: "Any communicant of the parish in good and regular standing, who is not less than eighteen years of age, a regular attendant in Cathedral worship in the year preceding election, and known by the treasurer to have made and maintained a stated financial commitment for church support in the year preceding election." (A "communicant" is a baptized member who has been confirmed.) The most important quality of an effective Chapter member is an ability to see the larger picture. Most have held leadership positions in more than one of the church's ministries or parochial entities.

After recommendations are given to the Nominating Committee, eligibility is verified and candidates are polled to confirm their interest and availability. The committee then chooses six strong candidates to send to the Chapter for approval. Finally, Chapter members are formally elected by the parish at the annual parish meeting in December.

The Nominating Committee reviews candidates who will round out the experience of the continuing Chapter members. We will seek to represent a broad range of age and gender groups, and a broad range of ministries and parochial entities of the Cathedral community.

Members of the committee include: Haven Long, Andrea Block, Michael Carrin, Mike Martin, Mary Perrin, Bronson Smith, and Daisy Starr.

CATHEDRAL TOWERS ENDOWED FUND

As a result of the transfer of operations of the Cathedral Towers/Parish Grove to National Church Residences in 2024, the Cathedral of St. Philip was able to establish the Cathedral Towers Fund as a designated fund within the Cathedral Endowment. The Cathedral Towers Fund will continue to support the Parish Grove community and support services and housing for low-income seniors in the broader community.

Over the past year, a nine-member committee of parishioners and Canon Julia Mitchener have met monthly with service providers to discern more about the community's needs and resources. In the coming months, the committee will further define their interests, approach, and application guidelines with the intent to begin grantmaking in 2026. While the fund will provide substantial support in the community, the committee is also immensely grateful to the wonderful residents of Parish Grove, the NCR team, and the many wonderful volunteers like St. Anne's Guild and Chaplain Dianne Otwell who are enriching the lives of our cherished neighbors at Parish Grove. Parish Grove residents are an important part of the life at the Cathedral, attending social events and bringing joy and companionship to so many. As always, the Cathedral Towers Fund also seeks to build community. While engaging with our community partners by volunteering and serving with them, the Cathedral also contributes monetarily to ensure stability for our partners' ongoing efforts to serve our neighbors.
