Four important steps to prepare for a safe and fun build day:

1. Read the Rules to Build By.
2. Review the Project Build Schedule.
3. Arrive at the build site (warehouse for Day 1 builds) on time. Builds begin at 7:30 a.m.
4. Commit to helping for the full build day.

what to wear

When you volunteer to build a new house with Atlanta Habitat, you will be working on a construction site. From head to toe, we want you to be safe and dressed comfortably.

- Weather appropriate shirt, sweater or jacket
- Sturdy pants such as jeans, khakis or shorts just above the knee (Leggings, tights, tennis skirts are not appropriate and potentially unsafe)
- Work gloves (We provide them, or you can wear your own)
- Hard hats (We provide them, or you can wear your own)
- Hard sole, sturdy shoes that you don't mind getting dirty (Construction boots, hiking boots, or sturdy running shoes/sneakers recommended. No sandals or open-toe shoes allowed on site)
- Plenty of sunscreen
- No jewelry

Gear such as safety glasses, ear plugs, and dust masks will be provided at the build site for work requiring extra protection.

rules to build by

Time Commitment

- **Arrive on time at the work-site** to participate in the required safety orientation.
- Commit to helping for the full build day.
- All volunteers are needed to help clean up at the end of the workday.

Age Restrictions

- No one under the age of 16 is allowed on site – no exceptions.
- Volunteers ages 16 and 17 must have a parent or guardian sign their *Release and Waiver of Liability*.
- Volunteers ages 16 and 17 will be excluded from certain activities, such as but not limited to, using power tools.

Tools and Materials

- All tools and supplies provided at work-site.
- Volunteers may bring tools; they must be marked with your name and phone number. Volunteers are not permitted to bring power tools. Atlanta Habitat is not responsible for damaged or lost items.
- Drinking water is provided on site.

Parking and Automobiles

- Volunteers are strongly encouraged to carpool. Parking is very limited.
- Please remove anything of value from your car. Atlanta Habitat is not responsible for car damage or stolen items.

Weather Conditions

- Atlanta Habitat builds year-round, rain or shine.
- Workdays are not typically canceled in advance due to adverse weather conditions.
- The house leader will shorten the workday if inclement weather persists or conditions become dangerous.

project build schedule

Eight Build Days

We build new homes in eight days over nine weeks. Each year, we help about 50 new families to become first-time homebuyers. You and the homebuyer will be guided by a house leader and skilled supervisors to build high quality, affordable and energy-efficient homes.



Day 1*

- Build exterior and interior wall frames in the Atlanta Habitat warehouse

Day 2

- Set floor joists and lay floor decking
- Apply sheathing to wall panels
- Install exterior and interior walls
- Install front porch deck, columns and beams
- Build side porch and stairs

Day 3

- Install
 - exterior doors and security doors
 - windows and trim packages
 - exterior trim and siding
 - exterior steps

Day 4

- Interior framing and air seal
- Complete siding installation
- Install soffit and fascia boards

Day 5

- Interior Trim
- Interior Doors
- Install soffit and metal
- Exterior Paint

Day 6

- Install
 - porch handrails
 - interior doors
 - kitchen cabinets
- Continue soffit and fascia board installations

Day 7

- Exterior painting
- Install
 - baseboards, window sills and interior trim
 - doorknobs and bathroom hardware

Day 8

- Clean interior of house
- Touch-up painting
- Complete miscellaneous tasks
- Remove construction debris from property
- Install landscape materials (sod, plants, trees, etc.)
- Dedication Day
 - on the final day of construction, house sponsors and volunteers join the new homebuyer family to dedicate the new home

Atlanta Habitat has worked with more than 5,000 family members to achieve the dream of affordable homeownership since 1983. Throughout the coronavirus pandemic, Atlanta Habitat continued to empower families. Our first-time homebuyer program, critical home repair (Repair with Kindness) and paint services (Brush with Kindness), homeowner education and financial coaching programs are a vital part of our mission.

Thanks to the generous support of our donors, we created the Home Matters mortgage-relief fund to assist homeowners impacted by the pandemic.

In 2021, Atlanta Habitat served 129 families. Our 2021 impact includes

Families

- Served 129 new families
- 56 homebuyers closed on their homes
- 119 mortgages paid-off since 2015
- 5 VGA scholarships awarded
- 94 percent met their mortgage obligations
- 175 financial coaching sessions attended
 - 83 percent are better-off financially

- 1,506 volunteers
- 11,905 hours of service
- \$340k value of volunteer time

Communities

- 24 new home builds
- 42 Repair with Kindness projects
- 63 Brush with Kindness projects

ReStore

- Open to the public to sell new and gently used furniture, appliances, home accessories and building materials at a fraction of the retail price
